Our first stop in September is San Francisco for a meeting of the local ICA group, Peter Wagner's International organization of church and ministry leaders which represents several million believers around the world. Then on to Boston for the first Strategic Life Training Intensive in the New England area. This is the last of four Intensives held this year in the United States. Sponsored by local churches, these Regional Intensives allow for greater growth by fostering local "ownership" of the program with less travel expenses. In some instances the program has been included in the training of church leadership and in high school curriculums.

In late September New York will be the site of the annual Strategic Christian Services Board meeting. This will be a particularly important meeting, as organizational changes are being considered to establish separate North American and International Boards due to our growth. Our goal is for each Board to productively focus on their area of responsibility so as to maximize the affect of SCS within their nations. Here in the U.S. we are in a season of great growth for both our flagship schools, Strategic Life Training (SLT) and the Business Leadership School (BLS). A separate North American Board will be able to concentrate on this.

In mid October, Dennis Peacocke goes to Chicago for the annual conference of Urban Ministries International (UMI) headed by Jeffrey Wright, husband of Lakita Garth Wright. This is a wonderful opening into the African American community. UMI supplies Sunday School materials to more than 12,000 African American churches weekly. They are considering ways to integrate SCS materials into theirs.

Next, our SCS Ambassadors Event will be in Atlanta. This group of supporters use their time, talent and treasure to further what we are able to accomplish together. These events are an opportunity for both new and old supporters to fellowship and give creative input to

Our last and longest trip this Fall will start in Kansas City, addressing a conference of The Joseph Company, affiliated with the International House of Prayer. At home and abroad the call to encourage and train Christians to serve God in their generation is being fulfilled in this great variety of venues. Strategic Christian Services is about stimulating practical action, not just theological "theory." It's happening, and thank you all for your part in making it possible!

Why is a Christian Worldview so Important?

Yes, we reject sexual sin, drunkenness, theft, and the "big sins", but we remain trapped in the world's left-right political games, the capitalism/socialism economic paradigm, and a host of unexamined cultural attitudes we all caught in our secular education. All of this is powerfully reinforced by the contemporary news and opinion-shaping media. This all shows up in the constant deterioration of our surrounding culture, a culture that believers are to be biblically transforming as "salt and light".

Without an effective and applied Christian worldview, believers will continue to only sporadically and nominally affect the world. Focused on heaven, believers leave God's earth to the world-system to manage its resources and control its people.

We either are too self-absorbed to care about the culture's captivity and the people's oppression, or we don't see the fundamental differences between the world-system and the Kingdom of God clearly enough to know how to strategically engage the transformation process. Both world evangelization and church reformation dramatically suffer.

For all of these reasons and more, Strategic Christian Services is committed to spreading a Christian Worldview to the nations through our Strategic Life Training and Business Leadership School, as well as conferences, educational materials, and influence. May our passion for Christ and love for people continue to deepen and make us even more effective in this quest.
