### The Transforum Event

Wow! The 2011 Transforum was packed full, fruit bearing, and a great venue for celebrating the 20-year anniversary of Strategic Life Training (SLT). This year's event featured diverse topics and many commented it was the best conference we have had in years! Whatever your jurisdiction of calling, there was an impartation of vision and practical tools for engaging that attendees were able to take home with them.

With the 20-year celebration of SLT, Graduates were featured front and center. SLT graduate, Lakita (Garth) Wright, returned as a keynote speaker. The Jones family came with their two eldest enrolled for a second generation of SLT and several other SLT graduates and Facilitators brought multiple generations of family participants. It was wonderful to see the opening plenary by Dennis Peacocke, "Living out a Strategic Legacy" being demonstrated!

Pastor Adam Peacocke, the early Director of SLT, spoke on the role of the church in the city. He focused on the need for congregations to work together and function out of their shared identification in the Body of Christ. Only then may community outreach through service reach its true effectiveness. From the civic point of view, participation of one church may be seen as advertising, whereas the service of a group of churches is news!

Adam also spoke on why worldview matters. The worldview battle is fought on three levels: the presuppositional level of the heart, the evidential level of the mind and the applicational level of our actions. He emphasized, it is not what we think, but how we think.

Dr. Gerald Chester shared how for Jesus, "Kingdom Business" made a meaningful difference by His use of authority, response to circumstances, work, and priorities. He noted that money was not an issue nor indication of the call of God.

Former NFL quarterback, Jeff Kemp, kicked off Friday evening with The Ultimate Team, coaching us on ways to face the "blitz" on marriage and family. Among his many insights was that marriage is no longer viewed so much as an investment, but as a consumer item. Jeff added to his impact with a message Saturday morning on Teamwork to Revive Marriage.

Again, looking at the role of the church in the culture, Lakita Wright offered information that challenged existing perspectives. Research shows that there are only a handful of so called "emerging churches" in the USA, but sadly, it virtually ignores the huge growth of immigrant, Bible believing churches. True, traditional denominations are on the decline, but to say that Protestant churches are declining shows the very parochial nature of much of the research on the matter. What a joy to see that missions have come full circle, and are sending their fruit to the USA and strengthening Christ's Body here.


Lakita, in her dynamic way, also gave us insight on the next generation. She emphasized the distinctions between the various generations and their understanding of each other, concluding that "shift happens."

## Growing in Christ by Jan Peacocke

It is wonderful that the Trinity provides us such a great coaching team, especially when the "exercise" is very challenging. One of my favorite songs asks the Lord to "open the eyes of my heart." This will allow me to see! As God works on us here on earth, there is a better chance of His will being done here as it is in heaven.
